Olive Grove Charter - Lompoc (OGCS) developed the SPSA for 2020-21 to meet the requirements for the use of federal funds in the absence of a Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) for this school year.

OGCS is a direct-funded charter school authorized by the California State Board of Education (SBE). The school operates a Title I Schoolwide Program (SWP). OGCS has not been identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement, Targeted Support and Improvement, or Additional Targeted Support and Improvement.

OGCS will meet ESSA requirements to support academic achievement so that all students, particularly the lowest-achieving students, demonstrate proficiency on the State's academic standards and California Dashboard Indicators. Involvement Process for the SPSA and Annual Review and Update

The OGCS ELAC/Advisory Council met to review data and this SPSA to ensure alignment and effective implementation of the LCAP and other federal, state, and local programs. Parents/guardians, students, and staff are invited to attend ELAC/Advisory Council meetings and fully participate equitably in the development and oversight process. In addition, two schoolwide surveys were conducted, and the analysis of responses was considered in the development of the plan and the budget. The ELAC/Advisory Council reviewed and approved the 2020-21 SPSA on December 3, 2020, and it was submitted to the OGCS Inc. Board of Directors for final approval at its regular meeting scheduled for December 8, 2020.
